

GENERAL NEWS.

Alger has gone on another vacation of 10 days.

A prairie fire that joined forces with a tornado, is doing great damage in Northern Nebraska.

At Butte, Mont., Lathrop D. Wallace, aged 17, died from the effects of being struck by a baseball while practicing.

Negotiations are on foot for the formation of a combine among the makers of silk ribbons and broad silk goods of the country.

Negotiations are on foot in New York with the view of consolidating the steel and iron interests with a capital of \$500,000,000.

Traction companies in Pittsburgh, Penn., have advanced the wages of their employees from 7 1/2 to 10 per cent. Fully 1400 men are affected.

The administration has decided to call for 35,000 more volunteers immediately, in case the rebels are not finally crushed at Culmpton.

Marines and sailors from the gunboat Nashville participated in the confederate decoration day ceremonies at Vicksburg, Miss., Wednesday.

Secretary Alger and Major-General Joseph Wheeler were welcomed by the Detroit Sons of the American Revolution on their arrival in Detroit on Saturday.

Ex-Governor John P. Altgeld, of Chicago, is recovering from a critical illness. At one time it was feared that the result might be fatal.

Emperor William of Germany will ask for the construction of 17 battleships and a number of swift cruisers. The present naval bills provide for the construction of only seven big battleships.

Among the arrivals at San Francisco from the Orient on the America Maru Friday was General Thomas M. Anderson, who has been ordered to report to the adjutant general for assignment to duty.

For the seventh time in as many years citizens of Galena, Illinois, on Wednesday paid tribute to the memory of General U. S. Grant, by exercising in commemoration of the anniversary of his birthday.

All the London morning papers contain editorial comments on the visit of General U. S. Grant to the Philippines, and complimenting the bravery and endurance of the American troops.

Lieutenant O. E. Lasher, U. S. N., who was thrown from his trap while out driving with his 6-year-old son at Monterey, Calif., April 21, has died of his injuries. He was a native of New York, aged 28 years.

The international Sunday school convention decided to hold their next meeting at Chicago, Ill., in 1900. Hon. John W. Wadsworth, of Philadelphia, was elected chairman of the executive committee of the international organization.

The opinion is expressed in Washington that the Anglo-Russian agreement regarding spheres of influence in China makes the retention of the Philippines by the United States more important and imperative than ever.

The British government has decided to contribute an annual sum of \$100,000 to the full amount recommended in the report of the Pacific cable committee of 1898 for the construction of a Pacific cable from British Columbia to Australia.

One of the most exciting campaigns in the history of Baltimore resulted Tuesday in a democratic landslide. Thomas G. Hay was elected mayor of the city, nearly 60,000 majority over William T. Maister, republican, the present incumbent.

Captain George C. Gibbs, who commanded the steamer River Queen, in the James river when President Lincoln and the confederate peace commissioners met on the steamer, died at his home in Sag Harbor, N. Y., aged 75 years.

The war department expects Chicago to supply 5000 recruits before January 1, 1900. It was estimated that the city has a reserve of 10,000 men.

Rev. J. B. Fuston, rector of Trinity Episcopal church, of Portsmouth, Va., was on Wednesday consecrated bishop of Boise, to which he was elected by the house of bishops of the Protestant Episcopal church in session in Washington last November.

It is said that the president has fully decided to relieve General Miles of the command of the army on account of the verdict of the beef board of inquiry, and that he will probably carry his fight to congress and attempt to have a congressional inquiry.

The moment peace is declared in the Philippines Dewey will start for the United States. He is estimated to have won duty with the Philippine commission as soon as peace is assured.

He has now a number of friends in Washington that he wants to bring with him to the national convention.

A very quiet movement is being worked in the national democratic committee to down Dewey as a candidate for the nomination of the next convention. Even those concerned in the movement have grave doubts about being able to succeed, as the committee was made up for silver at the national convention.

United States Senator Henry M. Teller had an accident falling from a Longmont, Colo., Wednesday afternoon. He had attended the funeral of ex-Accidentary General Byron L. Carr. After the funeral he faintly protested church. He was taken to the residence, and it was about 15 minutes before he regained consciousness.

Letters from the Russian provinces of Russia tell a harrowing tale of distress. In the province of Kazan, the center of the famine district, the Red Cross Society alone has lost 132,000 people.

The relief delegate in the province of Ufa reports that peasants starve after being begged for food on their knees in the snow.

Emperor William has given an indication of his friendship for the United States by sending a personal cable dispatch to President McKinley thanking him for his action in authorizing the landing of a German cable on American soil. Immediately upon receipt of the message it was telegraphed from the White House to the president in Philadelphia.

In the circuit court of appeals at St. Louis Tuesday is a unanimous decision was made in the appeal in the case, to the effect that a trust cannot cloak its objects under the form of a corporation and evade the penalties provided for violations of the Missouri anti-trust law of 1891.

Counties with trusts operating as corporations in Missouri are not collectible.

It is reported that General Miles does not mean to rest easy under the white wash report of the army board of inquiry, but means to continue the fight for his vindication. If necessary, he will seek an investigation by congress. He got fagged out and sat down on a log to rest, but he was overcome by the cold and rain.

BUILDING IN PORTLAND.
The Portland Telegram says:
The price of hardware has advanced 100 per cent.
The price of plumbing has advanced 60 per cent.
The price of brick has advanced about 20 per cent.

The lumber market remains firm and combine prices prevail for the higher grades, notwithstanding the collapse of the combine.

Carpenters, plumbers, plasterers and, in fact, almost all classes of tradesmen demand an increase of wages.

These are some of the conditions that are confronting those who are building or contemplating the building of houses in Portland. The cost of nearly all material has advanced, and there are prospects of still further advances.

This is a state of affairs the contemplation of which does not fill those who are building with joy or enthusiasm.

It is estimated that it costs just about one-fourth more to build a house today than it did six months ago. The advance in the price of plumbing is due to the lead and copper trade. Nails have increased exactly 100 per cent in price by reason of the advance in the price of the steel used in the manufacture of the nails.

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A Fall of Forty Feet.
