MORO CITY COUNCIL.

ORDINANCES NOW IN FORCE.

Published by Authority.
[No. 18]

AN ORDINANCE to provide for licensing
regulating, restraining and prohibiting
the sale of intoxicating liquors,
bar rooms, drinking shops, and tipping
houses.

The city of Moro does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. No person, persons or
firm shall in this city, directly or indirectly,
in person or by another, sell,
barter or deliver, or knowingly permit
to be sold, bartered or delivered,
for or on his or their account, any
spirited, vinous, fermented or malt
liquors, in any quantity whatsoever,
to be drunk either within or without
his or their premises, without first
obtaining a license therefor.

SEC. 2. Each applicant for a license
under the provisions of this ordinance
shall, before applying to the common
council therefor, at his own trouble
and expense, obtain the signatures of
an actual majority of the whole number
of legal voters of the city of Moro,
to a petition to the common council
thereof, praying that such license
be granted; and no applicant shall be
deemed to have a majority of the legal
voters of such city, whose petition
does not contain the names of a
number of legal voters of such city
equal to a majority of all the votes
cast in such city, at the last preceding
municipal election, and greater than the
whole number of names of legal voters
of such city, which may be signed to
any remonstrance against the granting
of such license; that when the signatures
of an actual majority of the whole
number of legal voters in said city
have been obtained, to be determined
as hereinafter provided, the
applicant shall, at his own expense,
cause the said petition to be published
in such city for four (4) consecutive
weeks, in any daily or weekly
newspaper published therein, together
with notice of the day on which
he will apply to the common council
for such license to sell spirited, vinous,
fermented or malt liquors—but
if there be no daily or weekly newspaper
published in said city, then the
petition and notice herein specified
shall be plainly written and posted
in three of the most public places in
said city for the period of four (4)
consecutive weeks, and proof of such
posting shall be made by affidavit of
one of the petitioners and two resident
householders of the city. At the time
of making such application, the
applicant shall present to said council
a bond in the sum of One Thousand
Dollars (\$1,000), with two or more
sureties, to be approved by the council,
conditioned that he will keep an orderly
house and comply with all the requirements
of the charter of the City of Moro, and of the
ordinances of such city, in its behalf
passed, or that may be passed during
the continuance of such license, and that
he will not permit any unlawful

gaming or riotous conduct in or about
his house or place of business, and
that he will not open or permit to be
opened, his place of business for the
purpose of traffic, on the first day of
the week, commonly called Sunday;
that he will not give, sell or supply,
spirited, vinous, fermented or malt
liquors, to women, girls, minors or
habitual drunkards, nor to any person
at the time in a drunken or intoxicated
condition. Thereupon, an applicant
producing the receipt of the city
treasurer for the payment of the sum
fixed for such license, as hereinafter
provided in Section 3, and upon proof
of compliance with all the provisions
of this ordinance, the common council
may, in its discretion, grant such
applicant a license for the term mentioned
in his receipt from the city
treasurer, but not less than six months
nor more than one year.

SEC. 3. Every person to whom a
license shall be granted under the
provisions of this ordinance, shall pay
into the city treasury the sum of
Eight Hundred Dollars per annum,
or a proportionate amount for a less
period. Provided, that no license
shall be issued for a less period than
six months, or a longer period than
one year.

SEC. 4. A license to sell spirited,
vinous, fermented or malt liquors
shall not be granted to a woman, minor,
or any person who shall permit
women, girls, or minors to frequent
his or their place of business, either
as guests, servants, waiters, waitresses,
dancers, singers, actors or musicians.

SEC. 5. Any person to whom a
license to sell spirited, vinous, fermented
or malt liquors, shall have been
granted, or any one in his employ,
who gives or sells any of such liquors
to any common drunkard or intoxicated
person, or to any woman, girl
or minor, or to any Indian, or shall
permit any woman, girl or minor to
frequent, visit or loiter around his
place of business, either as guest,
servant, waiter, waitress, dancer,
singer, actor or musician, shall be
guilty of a misdemeanor and upon
conviction thereof, shall be fined not
less than twenty-five dollars nor
more than one hundred dollars or be
imprisoned in the city jail not less
than twelve days nor more than fifty
days, or by both such fine and imprisonment,
and such judgment of
conviction or the conviction of a
breach of any ordinance that is now,
or may hereafter in this behalf be
passed, shall revoke the license of
such person.

SEC. 6. No person to whom a license
to sell spirited, vinous, fermented
or malt liquors shall have been
granted, or any employee therein shall
permit any games of any kind to be
played with cards, dice, or other
gambling devices, or keep any room
or rooms in said house, where card
playing or gambling is allowed, or
keep any room or rooms where chairs,
lounges, benches, tables, stools or
seats of any kind are placed therein,
except one chair, to be exclusively
used by the proprietor of said house;
nor shall said house be kept open for
the purpose of traffic or otherwise,
on the first day of the week commonly
called Sunday, nor shall said house
be kept open a longer time on other
days than from five o'clock in the
morning until twelve o'clock midnight,
nor shall loud talking, singing,
profane or other improper language
be allowed in said house. But one
room only shall be used in conducting
said business of selling intoxicating
liquors. Provided, however, that
there may be one room adjoining the
sale room to be used exclusively for
storing such spirited, vinous, fermented
or malt liquors as may be necessary
to conduct said business. Nor shall he,
nor shall he, on the day of a general
or city election, held under the laws
of the state, the United States, or
under the charter of this city, sell,
give, or otherwise dispose of intoxicating
liquors to any person during the
voting hours of such election any
person violating this ordinance shall
be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor,
and upon conviction thereof shall be
fined not less than twenty-five dollars
nor more than one hundred dollars,
for each offense, or be imprisoned in
the city jail not less than twelve days
or more than fifty days, or by both
such fine and imprisonment, and in
addition thereto shall forfeit the license
to sell such liquors.

SEC. 7. All licenses granted under
the provisions of this ordinance shall
be due and payable on the first day
of January and the first day of July
of each and every year, and all persons
applying for a license between said
times above specified shall pay a proportionate
amount for the unexpired

time between the date of the license
and the first day of the next semi-
annual payment, together with the
amount for the six months next following.

SEC. 8. No license shall be issued
to an applicant by the recorder until
ordered to do so by the council, and
no license issued shall be assignable
or transferable.

SEC. 9. Whenever, by reason of a
violation of this ordinance a license
shall have been declared forfeited, the
recorder shall report such forfeiture
to the common council at the next
meeting thereafter, and the council
shall not for the period of one year,
grant the same person, persons or
firm a license to sell spirited, vinous,
fermented or malt liquors. Such
revocation, however, shall not in any
manner operate to relieve the person
or persons to whom the same has
been granted, from such penalty or
punishment as may be prescribed for
the violation of any of the provisions
of this ordinance.

SEC. 10. It shall be the duty of the
marshal to institute prosecutions for
the violation of this ordinance whenever
he shall have reasonable cause to
believe that any person or persons
have been guilty of a violation of the
same, and upon their conviction for
such violation, the marshal shall, in
addition to his other fees, receive a
fee of five (5) dollars, and the same
shall be taxed against the defendant
as part of the costs of the case. Provided,
that nothing in this section
shall be construed to prevent any
person other than the marshal, instituting
an action for violation of this ordinance.

SEC. 11. Any person, persons or
firm who shall violate any of the provisions
of Sections 1 and 2 of this
ordinance, shall, upon conviction
thereof before the recorder's court, be
fined in a sum not less than twenty-five
nor more than one hundred dollars,
or be imprisoned in the city jail
not less than 12 nor more than 50
days for each offense, or by both
such fine and imprisonment, and each
day in which a violation takes place,
shall be considered a separate and
new offense.

SEC. 12. Immediately after the approval
by the mayor of this ordinance,
or if the mayor fails or neglects
to approve the same, immediately after
the expiration of the time allowed
for approval by the mayor, and immediately
after the passage by the council
of this ordinance, notwithstanding
the veto of the mayor, a copy of this ordinance, certified
by the recorder, shall be posted in three
public places in the city, then this
ordinance shall take effect and be in
force seven days after such posting.

city of Moro this 31st day of July,

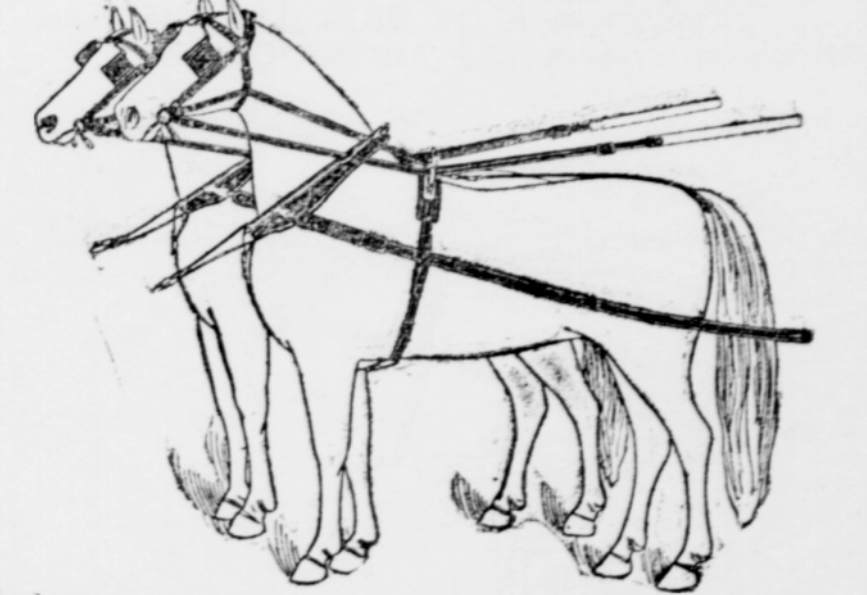
