THE NOTORIOUS DALY BILL.

In reply to The Observer comments on "the notorious Daly bill," The Oregonian rises to assert that "The Daly law makes no change at all in the text books to be used in the public schools."

In the same breath asserting that "The essence of the Daly law is a change in the manner and means of selecting the books."

That's the very point. And the "manner and means" by which the notorious "bill" became the "law" may be the "manner and means" by which the proposed change in the text books to be used in the public schools next year will have to be made.

The Oregonian perhaps did not wish to assert that we were intentionally falsifying when we claimed that that "notorious bill" makes it compulsory for parents to put up about \$400,000 next year for the proposed change in books!

We assert that there was no necessity for any change—and, in its argument the Oregonian admits that much—and its writer realizes, as fully as we do, that there must be a change under the Daly law; no matter what the cost may be to parents, but excuses the matter by claiming that the law simply provides "new methods for making the change." The selection is taken out of the hands of one school machine and placed into the hands of another school machine. This The Oregonian admits, and in this appears to see ample justice in compensation. Now readers await results; and when you parents begin to pungle for the new books you will be able to more clearly define which: The Observer or The Oregonian, is right in this discussion.
