J.L. Morrissey of Palouse, planted 1650 acres to sugar beets this year, for the Waverly factory, and the "experiment" cost him \$20,000. The yield run about five tons to the acre, and \$4.00 a ton was all the factory would pay. Cost of production is estimated at \$25 per acre.

The new tourist sleepers sent out by the ORNCO daily now at 8 p.m. are models of perfection. There was a time when a tourist sleeper appealed to a limited number of people who were traveling on the cheap order, in every meaning of the term. Now, however, the class of passengers has improved, and one may travel upon them and enjoy all the privileges of a first class sleeper at a decent price.

Even the most frivolous and heedless persons must be awakened to a sense of their manifold blessings by reading the beautiful words of President McKinley's chaste Thanksgiving proclamation. The people of the United States of America may have felt vaguely that they ought to be thankful in a general way, but only after reading the President's eloquent sentences can they appreciate truly the particular benefits showered upon them.

That spraying pays is shown by the experience of S. A. Sears. He has a small orchard in Hood River which he sprayed several times during the season, and his crop netted him 500 boxes of apples which command \$1.75 per box. Not 2 per cent of his crop was wormy, against 50 per cent of orchards not sprayed right about him, the fruits of which are unmarketable. When a person buys wormy apples he encourages thrift in moths which destroy orchards.

SEED WHEAT EXPERIMENTS.

The Eastern Washington experiment station is trying to find a better variety of seed for the wheat fields of the Waiting Empire. At present there are three principal varieties, red chaff, bluestem and little club, raised here—all spring wheat and good producers. But what we want is a variety that can be planted in the fall, that will stand up, and yield under weather such as we had last winter and spring.

Experiments with 95 varieties of winter wheat have been made, but none of them have been found to be what is wanted in this particular climate. With the exception of 20 varieties all the grain tried shatters to such an extent that they are undesirable. Many of them do not yield well, and this is a serious objection. Others have weak straw, and cannot withstand the wind. Others make an inferior quality of flour.

Some of the varieties experimented with combine two or more of the necessary qualities, and the effort is now in the direction of crossing the different varieties which constitute and combine the desired qualities. The result will eventually be a wheat that will yield well, make good flour, have good straw and will not shatter—such a wheat will add thousands of dollars to the income of our farmers.

Bluestem sells for 3c more per bush than little club, though the latter produces about three more bushels to the acre, because bluestem makes a whiter flour which commands a better price. By improving the quality of little club, until its flour shall be as white as that of bluestem, we may have the wheat which yields the most per acre commanding the highest price, and thus reverse the present condition of things.
