Jonathan Bourne, Jr.



Republican Candidate for United States Senator.
Champion of Statement One.

Jonathan Bourne, Jr., candidate be-
fore the republican primaries for the
nomination of United States Senator in
congress, for the long term commencing
March 4, 1907, was born in New Bedford
Mass., February 24, 1855; was a mem-
ber of the class of 1877 at Harvard Uni-
versity; came to Portland May 16, 1878;
was a republican member of the Oregon
legislature in the session of 1883 and the
extra session of 1886; was one of Oregon's
delegates to the Republican National
convention of 1888, and Oregon member
of the Republican National committee
from 1888 to 1902, and a delegate to the
Republican National convention of 1892;
and was elected as a Mitchell republican
to the Oregon legislature in 1896.
Mr. Bourne has been more prominently
identified with the development of the
mineral resources of Oregon than any
other man in the state, having expended
in the last 20 years over \$1,000,000 of his
own money in the acquisition and devel-
opment of Oregon mines.

While Mr. Bourne has had his resi-
dence and main office at Portland since
1878, he has had another office at New
Bedford, Mass., and has carried on the
business of his father's estate since 1889,
which makes him familiar with many of
the large interests and leading men in
the East. These qualifications, in con-
junction with his energy, originality, ex-
ecutive ability, and experience in busi-
ness, and political affairs, pre-eminently
qualify him for making an able and in-
fluential Senator from the state of
Oregon.

Mr. Bourne has always favored ex-
tending the direct power of the people
over their government as far as possible.
He was one of the leading spirits in the
Initiative and Referendum movement,
from 1896, until it was approved by the
voters at the June election in 1902. In
1904 he was a member of the executive
committee of the Direct Primary Nomina-
tion League, and holds the same po-

sition with the People's Power League at
this time. In all these movements he has
been one of the few to guarantee the nec-
essary expense of preparing and propos-
ing their measures to the people.
He says that the choice of United
States Senators should be by direct vote
of the people, and that the legislature
should be compelled to elect the man
the people select. To accomplish this
result he is championing Statement No. 1
of the primary elections law as the only
method by which public opinion may be
crystallized and made effective upon the
legislature. In his petition for nomi-
nation Mr. Bourne says:

If I am nominated and elected I will
during my term of office, favor:
Republican politics
Amending National constitution for
people's election of United States
Senators.
Publicly political campaign expenses.
National control of corporations in in-
terstate commerce.
Rigid exclusion of Asiatic coolie labor;
Good wages make good citizens
Legal limitation labor hours for safety
on railroads.
Parcel post, including rural delivery.
Pure food laws.
Liberal appropriations for Panama ca-
anal; coast defenses, river and harbor
improvements, including Columbia
and Willamette rivers, Coos, Yaquina
and other Oregon harbors, Cello ca-
nal, government canal at Oregon city
Fair share of irrigation fund for
Oregon.

Loyal support of successful candidates.
Rigid enforcement Statement One.
Roosevelt for second elective term.
I desire that the following statement
be printed after my name on the nomi-
nating ballot:
I WILL SUPPORT PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT
DETERMINATION THAT JUSTICE BE
DONE ALL MEN."

Oregon and especially to candidates for
public office. It would be a good idea

to be filled in the election next June,

The necessary preliminary to every
man's candidacy is that he shall be put
forward for a nomination by petition

of at least two per cent of the votes
cast in June, 1904, for his party's nomi-
nees for congress, in the state at large,
or a county, or a judicial district, or a
state senatorial, or representative, or
congressional district, as case maybe.

The candidate who shall enter the
primary in this manner and shall re-
ceive the most votes of his party for
the nomination, will be the nominee of
the party, and will be voted for in the
usual manner at the June election.

The number of signatures required on a
republican primary petition for a state
nomination will be 1000, the maximum
required by the law, on a democratic
petition, 500. Candidates for a repub-
lican nomination in the first congres-
sional district must each secure 479
signatures, in the second district,
243. Candidates for the democratic
nomination must each obtain 343
signatures in the first district, and 255
in the second.
