MORO SCHOOL MEETING.

At the annual school meeting on Monday the clerk reported the enumeration of children of school age to be 177—92 boys and 85 girls.

The financial report shows cash received for the school year just closed, \$5,467.26, and the same sum paid out by warrant. The outstanding warrant indebtedness is now \$1,384.14, a reduction since last annual meeting of \$878.00, with prospects good that by the next annual meeting the warrant debt will all be paid off, leaving a balance to the credit of the treasury.

A noteworthy incident in this connection is the fact that Mr. Parry was elected as school director in this district at the March annual in 1895, and has since served continuously. When first elected there were but about 40 pupils enrolled in the district; but one teacher, and of course the school was not graded.
