Cheap Fare East.

The passenger department of the OR & N has issued a circular announcing special excursion rates for the coming summer season. One limited first class fare, plus \$10, is the rate for round trip tickets to all the principal points of the east and middle west. Tickets on this basis may be purchased for Chicago, St. Louis, St. Paul, Minneapolis, Duluth, Kansas City, Omaha, Atchison, Omaha, Leavenworth, Council Bluffs and Sioux City.
