Postal cards, mailed under cover of sealed envelopes, transparent or otherwise, are chargeable with postage at the first class rate. If enclosed in unsealed envelopes they are subject to postage according to the character of the message, at first rate if wholly or partly in writing, or the 3d rate, if entirely in print, and postage must be affixed to the envelopes covering them. Stamps fixed to such cards inclosed in envelopes having an opening exposing the stamps, cannot be recognized in payment of postage thereon. However, where such cards, properly addressed and pre paid, bearing no matter rendering them unmailable under postmaster-general's orders, when sent openly in the mails, are inclosed in envelopes, it will be assumed that they were inadvertently placed under cover, and may be removed therefrom and dispatched without additional payment of postage. While upon this topic of post office regulations we may call attention to the fact that letters mailed at a post office for delivery by star route carrier, and in boxes along rural delivery route, are subject to the 2d rate.
