Hon J D Lee, of Multnomah, one of the Republican Electoral College nominees on the Taft ticket in this state, is to address the voters at the Court house in Moro, at 7.30 p. m., Wednesday, October 28th. Every body is invited to attend.

Senator Fulton appeared to be in cheerful mood in spite of his failure to meet his appointments in Sherman county, in consequence of the difficulties of travel through adobe land. The storm broke over Prineville on the 12th, and for four days poured down more rain than had fallen in the 12 months preceding. There were no cloudbursts or waterpots, as sometimes occur, but rain fell steadily. The Crook county fair opened under smiling, cool, autumnal skies, but the sunshine lasted for a few hours only.

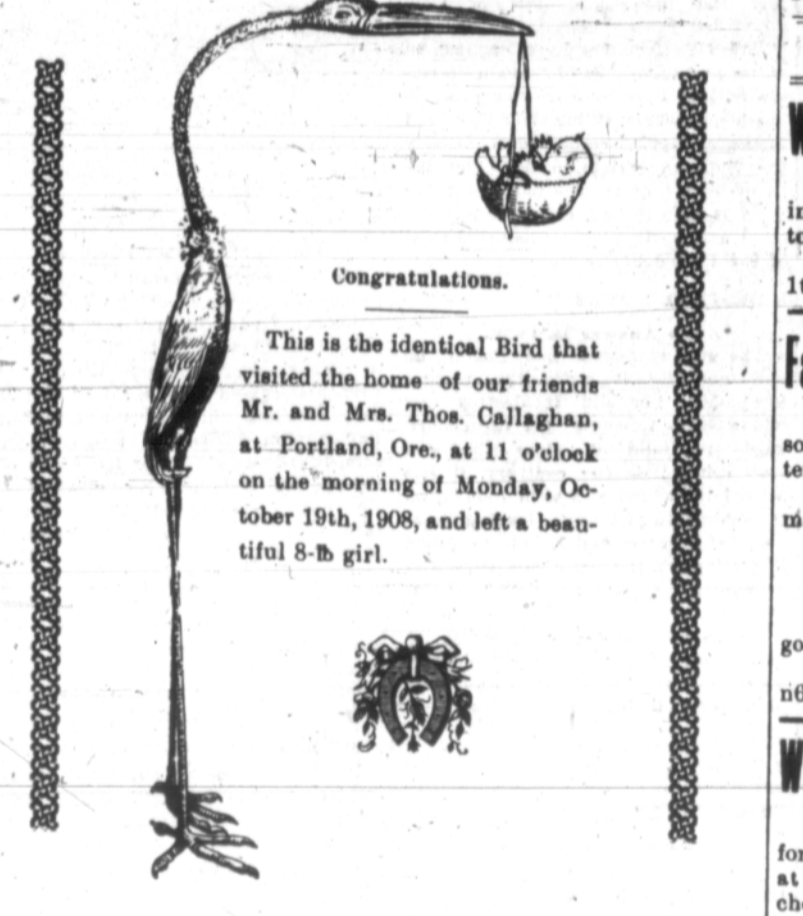

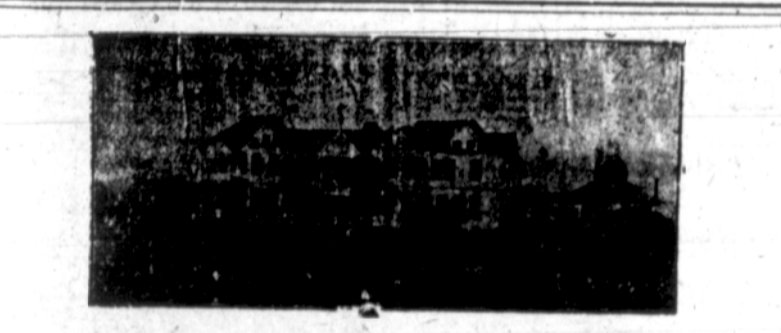
