HOME AND FARM.

If the knife is held perpendicularly when cutting hot bread, or a cake, it cuts smoother slices.

Peppermint sprigs, or a few drops of the oil of peppermint will drive away rats and mice if placed where they are most in evidence.

Fish must not be fried in a covered pan, even if the fat does spatter over the stove.

An old housekeeper says that if a kettle of jam or preserves is scorched in cooking, to set it immediately in a pan of cold water will restore the flavor, unless it is really burned.

For winter, when vegetables are frosted, prepare them for cooking and cover with cold, salted water; let them stand over night in a moderately warm room.

Scattering lime or cayenne pepper are said to drive away fleas and one teaspoonful of tartar emetic mixed with an equal amount of sugar and put where ants of any kind are troublesome, will rid the house of these pests.

Pin a piece of soft, heavy woolen cloth around the arm of your sewing machine and you will have the handiest possible pin cushion, on which the pins taken from the sewing may be placed without danger of the cushion falling to the floor or slipping away when most needed.

All white meats gain an added flavor from onions, and one desired by most people, and the proper way to add it is to grate the onion fine and spread it over the meat just before it is done, blending it by frequent basting.
