But if we could save these \$700,000,000, we should increase our total income from farm by almost 1 1/2th, and might easily increase the population of the United States by 10 or 20,000,000. We have already begun in this way to save a good many millions. We have drawn upon chemistry, we have invented sprays and washes, fumigations and insecticides, and have used them with varying success. Sometimes we fail; once there was a contest between the people of Massachusetts and a caterpillar, after expending \$8,000,000, and infinite patience, the people gave in—and the caterpillar won out.
