Dalles City Chronicle. The Dalles Hospital will be entirely remodeled, and another story and a half added to that already large institution.

When completed the building will be equipped with all modern fittings which go to make comfort for patients, and also all modern and best appliances for the treatment of disease.

Four iron fire escapes will make it impossible to be caught in the building in case of fire, and two immense porches, reaching to the third floor on both the front and back elevations, will give comfortable and ample room for convalescents to enjoy the fresh and invigorating air, and will also open up a view across the Columbia and to Mount Adams, which cannot be excelled.
