Circuit Court Proceedings.

Circuit court for the May 1910 term convened in this city Monday, Judge R R Butler presiding.

Just before court convened Jas Tomlin, by his attorneys Wilson & Mowry filed suit against the Wind river Lumber company for \$1,950, alleging contributory negligence in providing poor wood sawing outfit, that resulted in his left arm being partly severed by the apparatus.

J J Wiley was indicted on seven counts for allowing minors to play pool in his establishment; fined \$25 on each of three counts, and four were passed over by Judge Butler.

A grand jury was drawn to hold from this term to the November term as follows: E C McMillin, SB Holmes, OC Hogue, IN Lemmon, Fred Krusow, W B Johnston, E M Harrington.

In the matter of the State of Oregon v. Fred Hendershott, Joseph York and James Payne, charged with cattle stealing: on motion of the district attorney the charge as to Hendershott was dismissed, the evidence being insufficient to convict. Payne and York were granted separate trials.

State v. James Payne, tried by the following jury: E D McKee, E E Kaseberg, H U Martin, C M Kuypus, E R McMillin, A J Holt, Chas Hull, Wm Oehman, W H Helyer, J A Ellis, A Cameron, Fred Ross. Verdict not guilty.

J E Smith, who was so neatly trapped by Sheriff Freeman last month dispensing booze in the south end of the county was arraigned. As the evidence was too convincing for the defendant to stand trial he pleaded guilty to violating the local option law. He very readily promised never to do it again, in this county at least, and upon such promise District Attorney Burdette recommended Judge Butler to impose the minimum fine of \$50; but the Judge thought the interests of the county would be better served by raising the fine \$100, which he did, making it \$150.

State v. York proceeded to trial Wednesday morning, with the following jury: E R McMillin, K A Kime, F S Lamborn, H U Martin, J Christianson, Wm Oehman, Chas Hull, D E Vinton, R T Morgan, J W Clark, C W Johnson, J O Thompson. It only took ten minutes for the jury to return a verdict of guilty.

All Sherman County Invited. Col. C. A. Buckley, of Grass Valley, is to give a picnic at his farm south of that city on Sunday May 29th, to which he invites all Sherman county to come, with their lunch baskets, for a jolly picnic dinner. Col. Buckley never does things by halves, and preparations for this occasion will be on a plan adequate to cope with all whom he desires to welcome there, and he is anxious to greet everybody.

It weighs about three pounds and is in first-class condition, and editor Kennedy anticipates something of a job to consume it all at one meal with the trimmings.
