Archbishop Ireland recently performed the remarkable ceremony of consecrating six priests as bishops at the same altar in the chapel of the Catholic theological seminary in St. Paul, Minn. The new bishops were immediately stationed in North Dakota, South Dakota and Minnesota, to minister to new congregations established in recently populated districts.

Japanese coal is delivered in Alaska for use on steamers of the United States government. The anti-Gugeneims protest against the policy, so long as Alaska has such a large quantity of undeveloped coal, Admiral Dewey says Alaskan coal can be obtained, unless on account of its monopoly; for Pacific ocean vessels, much below the cost of Virginia coal. It cost \$4.50 per ton to transport the Virginia coal to the Pacific coast, and an additional \$2.75 per ton to Manila and Yokohama. "Furthermore," says Admiral Dewey to Secretary Meyer, "in case of war in Pacific waters it would be advantageous to the government to have a large supply of coal at an Alaskan port."

The big floating drydock Dewey, which was taken to the Philippine waters some time ago at a great expense and stationed at Olongampo, is at the bottom of the bay in 70 feet of water, due to the water displacing valves being left open by careless employees. It was a \$1,000,000 craft and is nearly a total loss; but Uncle Sam has plenty of funds, regardless of the annual deficit, and can stand a little thing like the sinking of a drydock by a careless, irresponsible flunkey.

A \$5,000 bet up on a base ball game in Georgia, has been decided against the winner-claim on account of errors, faulty playing. Such decision, could it be had generally, without further violating the laws, would so cut out the gambling element as to reduce the play to the plane of sport; where it was before the schemer and the grafter took hold of it.

Theodore's Slang Took Paris.

Mrs. Severance of Spokane, who is traveling in Europe, writes to relatives that Col. Roosevelt non-plussed all Paris by injecting a few western expressions into his notable address in the amphitheatre of the Sarbonne. And as a result she said, men of state and affairs, society matrons and debutantes, club men, merchants, students and laborers, have contracted the cinch habit. They also make frequent use of the word shack, employed by Mr. Roosevelt in telling a story of the plains, which has for its climax this pregnant sentence: "If you would steal for me it's a 'cinch' you will steal from me; go to the 'shack' and get your time!" Every where we hear whisperings of: "What is that shack? and what is the cinch?" Another sentence that is likely to become as famous as a Lincoln phrase, is distinctively Rooseveltian. "Every man must pull his own weight before he meddles with the ship of state; every man's first duty is toward his family; every child that is brought into the world has a right to the support and protection of its father."

To Wipe out the Interior Department.

It is reported that President Taft would substitute a department of public works for the department of the interior. His idea is that the proposed new department should include reclamation, irrigation, the Panama canal, management of the national domain, forestry, conservation, and the construction of public buildings. Immense, isn't it?

But the present interior department is such a Chinese box of divisions and bureaus, having only an arbitrary bond of connection, that the country will welcome anything Mr. Taft may accomplish toward reforming the department and putting it in touch with present-day conditions.

The dispatch draws general attention to what Mr. Taft said in April about the entire system of the United States doing business. It is antiquated, singular, wasteful. What Secretary Meyer has achieved in reorganizing the naval bureaus has already saved 10,000,000 dollars. In the treasury department Secretary MacVeagh has cut expenses \$2,000,000. If modern methods and systems are installed in every department the national government will save \$100,000,000 a year.
