A bad fire was checked, fortunately, by sheer luck, as the chimney in the old wind raked tenement is absolutely dangerous, no mortar to be called such holding the bricks together, but dry boards are used for facings, and the fire house is so near a collapse that it was deemed unsafe to ring the alarm bell.

The Tacoma stadium is a big thing in more ways than one; it is the means of making people stand up and take notice that Tacoma is on the map. When the Roosevelt show was pulled off there last week 30,000 people were seated. Portland was crowded to find room for 5,000; Seattle 4,000. Tacoma leads every city on the coast in this respect, and no investment since the city was incorporated, has been worth one half as much to the city. It cost about \$125,000, all raised by public subscription, and there has never been heard a regretful sigh that the money was put to such use.
