Give the floor a coat of good cream floor paint, and when dry give a second coat. When thoroughly dry, and you should wait several days, give it a coating of oak oil stain. This registry system could easily be amended so that the people need not register every two years; it would be a better plan and less expensive if when a voter first registered a certificate be issued to that effect by the county clerk and in the event of a change of residence this certificate be returned to the office of the clerk and the change noted.
