With 12,820 postoffices receiving savings from 350,000 depositors amounting to \$350,000,000, the postal saving bank is not proving a discredit to the republican administration which introduced it.

The United States senate has passed a bill authorizing the state of Oregon to exchange 40,000 acres of school section land in forest reserves for a compact body of land in the Santiam reserve, which land shall be held by the state for a permanent state reserve.

The proposed trip of the directors of American chambers of commerce through the west and along the Pacific coast shows that the interior and the east are awakening to the commercial importance of the cities this side of the Rockies.

Jackson county shows enterprise in getting the first federal aid highways. By putting up \$10,000 the United States government takes over 50 miles of rural mail routes to improve and maintain.

Would Row Wilson be beginning to get in bad with the people of the United States. His postmaster general has again been requested to go some where else by a postmaster who has been asked to resign to make room for a political appointee.

An international monument at Niagara is proposed as a memorial to the century of peace along the boundary between Canada and the United States.

County Taxes Paid Promptly.

The report of J. C. McKean as sheriff and tax collector for Sherman county on account of the current tax roll for the year 1912 is the best record of collections of that office since the incorporation of the county, reckoning as to the percentage of collections as compared with the gross amount of the tax roll and the amount remaining on hand to be collected this fall on half payments before the same become delinquent.

The total amount of the 1912 tax roll was \$106,560.89 when turned over to Sheriff McKean for collection; of which amount there was remaining unpaid on June 30th \$20,172.53.

According to the report there was collected between February 10th and March 15th \$67,550.99 less rebates allowed by law \$2,024.39; a total of \$65,526.60. Between March 15th and June 30th \$18,947.43; including \$110.06, penalty and interest. Added to the above should be collections from the tax rolls for the years 1909-1910-1911 amounting to \$2,502.95.

Local People Visit Crater Lake.

L. Barnum and wife, Mary Kunsman, R. C. Atwood and wife, the Misses Ferry of Chicago, cousins to Mr. Atwood, and W. M. Watkins assistant auditor of the O.-W. R. & N. Co., and wife of Portland, returned Wednesday evening from an eight day outing by auto to as far south as Crater Lake, going by way of old Fort Klamath and within 50 mile of the California line and taking the machines to within a mile of Crater Lake itself, being stopped by snow.

The party originally intended nothing but a fishing trip, but learning at Odell lake that an auto could get within a few miles of Crater Lake decided upon extending the trip to that Nature's Wonder Land. They were at the rim of the crater Saturday, July 12th, gazing a thousand and one feet straight down to the waters of Crater Lake below them, which to those who wish to get nearer must be descended by a steep stairway.

Mr. Barnum said upon his return that of all the various fishing resorts that he had visited that of Odell lake was hard to beat; the three fishermen in two hours caught 244 with hook and line.

Land Declared Forfeited.

Judge Wolverton, of the United States Circuit Court, has signed a decree forfeiting 2,075,616 acres of land in Oregon from the Oregon & California and Southern Pacific Railroad companies to the United States, and enjoining them from ever again asserting ownership of the land.

The decree provides that the lands forfeited are those remaining unsold in the grants made by congress in 1866 to encourage the building of a railroad from Portland, into California, and in 1870 to encourage the building of a line from Portland to Astoria and McMinnville.
