Arranging for School Childrens Fair.

The executive committee of the school childrens industrial fair association met at Moro last Saturday at the call of the chairman, F.E.Fagan county superintendent, to complete arrangements for this annual event.

Those present were P.M.Nash of Moro schools, J.O.Russel of Wasco schools, A.B.Cash of Grass Valley schools, F.E.Dunton of Kent school, and Mrs.M.E.Clark of Rufus school.

It was decided that Saturday, October 11th, the last day of the Sherman county fair be also the school childrens industrial fair day, and that P.M.Nash be placed in charge of the arrangement of the exhibits and that he secure competent help to assist him.

There will be no fees or charges of any sort against any exhibits entered for contest in the school childrens industrial fair. All children desiring to exhibit at the fair must deliver their exhibits to the committee at Moro, either by mail, express, freight, or otherwise in person. The committee, upon notification, will take charge of exhibit at the point designated as above and after the fair return them to the same place, for which no charge of any sort will be made.

Judges selected for the mechanical exhibits are Geo.Meader of Wasco and Chas.Boardman of Kent; the poultry exhibit will be judged by L.P.Harrington, of the state superintendents office, who will also address the children, at the county fair grounds, Saturday afternoon along industrial lines; judges for the culinary, agricultural, and sewing will be selected later.

All exhibits must be in the hands of the arrangement committee by Thursday of fair week; sending them to the Executive Committee of the School Childrens Fair, Moro.

One county in Ohio that voted a considerable sum of bonded indebtedness for good roads has had its cash valuations of land drop from around \$200 an acre to near \$75. Bonded indebtedness is only another word for a first mortgage.

Corn experts are using the recent drought in Kansas as an object lesson in farming. Both the kafir and milo stood the hot weather very much better than the regular corn and wheat crops. As a dry land crop to be fed on the farm they cannot be beat.

Residents of Wasco county and The Dalles are interested in a new proposed railroad up Mill creek which will be used to haul logs to a mill that will be built by the promoters of the project at that city. The new mill will employ 300 men and cut 100,000 feet of lumber each day. If built work will begin about the first of the year.

Petitions are being circulated in The Dalles for a vote to be taken at the special election November 4th on the question in that city of "wet" or "dry." Enough signers to the petitions have been secured to make certain such an election will be held. It is considered by those engineering the work that enough dependence can be placed upon the new woman voters to carry the election for a dry town.

A popular hearing was held by the state railroad commission in Salem, Tuesday of this week. It may not have been popular with the public utilities of the state, but undoubtedly it was with those who have to pay meter rates for water, light and gas. It will be a satisfaction when the bill collector comes around to know that the water and electric juice is measured through a meter, state tested and guaranteed to be true.

C. C. Moore, of the United States department of chemistry, has been in Oregon for two weeks studying the adaptability of Oregon as a manufacturer of starch. He has declared his faith in the possibility of establishing factories for the manufacture of starch and glucose from potatoes and has had a meeting with prominent Portland business men with this end in view. The establishment of a starch mill in Oregon would supply an outlet for surplus spuds during seasons of low prices.

Edgar Allan Poe fancied that the ancients would be but slightly surprised at the marvels of modern days. The British association for the Advancement of Science has corroborated his notion. An agricultural chemist lecturing before it asserted that the Egyptians more than 10 centuries before Christ had incubators and that these were so inexpensive and efficacious that the sons of Mizraim produced 130,000,000 chicks a year.
