Eighteen dozen china pheasants are being given their liberty this month in Sherman county at fifteen different locations as follows: Rufus at the G.W. Blackburne and F.E. Brown orchards; at the John Fulton farm west of Wasco; at the farms of L.L. Peetz, L.V. Moore, F. A. Sayre, Clare Axtell, Robt. Urquhart, near Moro; at the C.A. Buckley, M. B. Taylor, Ray Ragsdale, J.B. Morrison, Fred Krusow, Irving Nottingham, farms near Grass Valley; at the J.N. McInnes farm near Kent.

These birds are raised at the Oregon Agricultural College farm near Corvallis and are brought to the county free of charge, the railroad and express companies make no charge for transportation.

All persons are warned that, under state law, all parts of Sherman county are, at all times, strictly closed to the shooting or injuring, in any manner, of china pheasants.

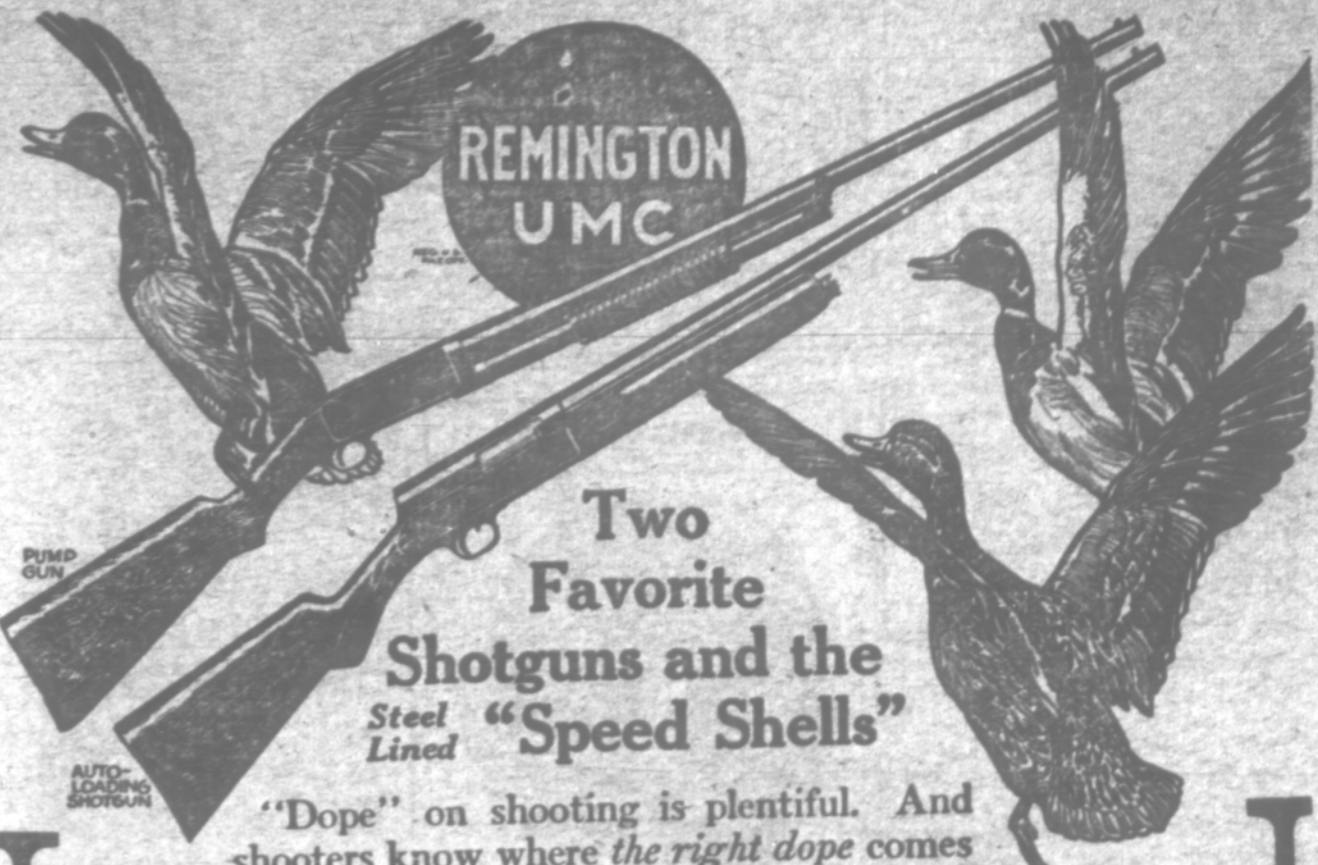
