The establishment of a postal rural route delivery service out of Moro for the eastern section of the county is being considered. The proposed route will leave Moro and go north to Demoss, then east by way of the Ginn farm to Monkland school at McLachlan farm, then to Monkland store and east by way of the canyon route to the Hans Thompson cross roads corner there turning south to the road passing in front of the Hay Canyon school house, turning at the school house south to the Wolford Belshie farm and there west to Boardman school house, from there to the Byers and Maxwell corner and from there on the Lone Rock road to Moro. The route will approximate thirty miles and supply 121 families.
