The case of Samuel Herrick vs. C. W. Barzee was non-suited in Portland last week. Herrick is a Washington, D.C., attorney, who fancies he has a claim against the Sherman county settlers for 20 per cent of the amount of their reimbursement for losses sustained at the time the government took their land from them. Through the efforts of Congressman Nick Sinnott, partial recompense has been made by the government. It is a total claim of \$10,000 for which Herrick is suing, altho the personal liability of Barzee was set at \$380. The non-suit stops Herrick from realizing on his claims.

The Hood River Glacier says plans for the construction of the Columbia River Highway between that place and Mosier have been blocked temporarily by the refusal of the O.W. R. & N. to approve the survey where they encroach on the railroad right of way. The railroad objects to a road along its right of way on the ground that construction work might possibly obstruct traffic. A conclusion that a condemnation suit would most likely change materially.

The city of Arlington, as well as the north half of Gilliam county, each a separate road district, have both voted a 10 mill special tax with which to provide funds to prepare the base for the Columbia River Highway on the route designated by the state commission. Morrow county has held special elections and voted a 5 mill tax in each of the two districts through which the highway runs. This action takes care of the highway from the Pacific ocean to the state line on the east, except as to the route in Sherman county where the state highway commission and the county court do not agree. The commission desiring to follow the river grade and leave the city of Wasco a few miles to the south of the main highway.

A large number of Sherman county base ball fans will remember L.K. Harlan who died on the 17th at LaGrande of typhoid fever. He was a very efficient amateur baseball pitcher and a successful news paper publisher. His last visit to Moro was about two years ago with the nine from Condon.
