Crossing No Man's land between the battle lines in France, with an armful of stale eggs, would be a ticklish business at best, but tossing them into the German trenches is a perilous prank that stuns and dumfounds the German enemy. Such a prank is spoken of in a letter recently published by the Oregonian from a friend of the Portland young man that did the trick. Such stunts as that will more quickly break the average German soldier's spirit than starvation long endured.

Sherman county is listed with the government as having enough seed for all spring seeding that may be done and as a consequence no seed will be shipped into this county, so say those who generally handle seed wheat. There is so much red tape to secure a license to ship in seed and the amount of accounting to do to handle the business according to government requirements that that also is another reason why seed will not come into the county except in very special cases. The shortage of railway cars is also another reason why the government does not favor moving seed wheat into a locality where there is supposed to be enough on hand for requirements.

Labor, Seed and Crop Survey Blanks Here.
The blanks for the survey have been received at the office of the county agent, and are ready for the farmers to sign. Plans are being made to get one or perhaps more men to be responsible for the blanks in each school district, and to see that each farmer has a chance to sign. This survey is instituted by the government and is being carried on in every state. Every bit of information placed in these blanks will be strictly confidential and no farmer need hesitate to sign it, fearing that it will be turned over to his assessor or any one else. A general summary will be taken from these blanks at the county agent's office as soon as they come in and then the blanks will be sent to J. W. Brewer, state farm help specialist, Portland, Oregon, where the information from the different counties is compiled, after which the blanks will be returned to the county. There are 466 farms in the county and we expect a blank from every one.
