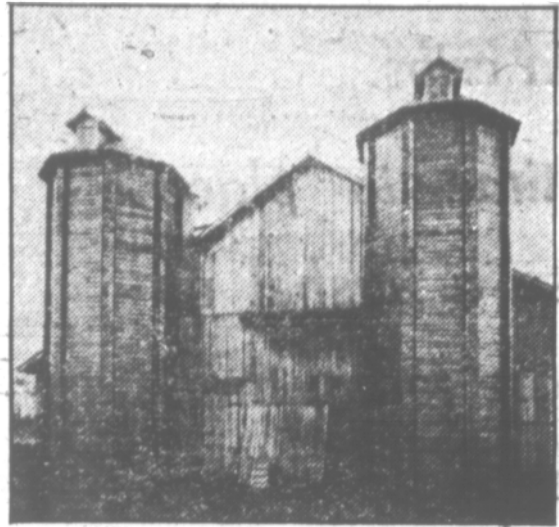

A number of farmers are using their caterpillar machinery to do considerable night work on their farms, operating in the absence of electric head lights by aid of lanterns.

A second income tax officer will be in Sherman county at Wasco on March 25th and 26th to consult with any who may not have been able to meet with the first officer to visit Sherman county.

Congressman Nick Sinnott is still trying to get the Geological Survey to sink at least one experimental artesian well in Eastern Oregon and has put the matter up again and again to Director George Otis Smith of the Geological Survey, which has charge of the matter.

Practical clothing, worn or new is being collected by the Red Cross for the Belgian relief. The articles can be left at Ginn, Coleman & Co., not later than Friday the 22d. Herman Pape is acting as chairman of the Moro committee.

During the month of January \$11,787,517 were paid out to farmers of the United States by the federal land banks on long-time first-mortgage loans, according to a statement by the federal farm loan board. On February 1 the total amount of money paid out to farmers since the establishment of the federal land banks was \$50,782,432, covering 24,020 loans.
