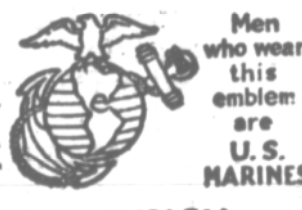

At a special meeting of the county court last Saturday, a contract was let to the Portland Bridge and Iron Co. for the building of a steel bridge over Grass Valley Canyon at Lone Rock to be completed by January 15th. Two firms were present with bids. The Coast Bridge Co. bid \$4150 and the successful firm \$3784.
