Help in Fighting Mosquitoes.
In fighting the mosquito pest it is well to remember that mallow stagnant pools may often be eliminated through planting of eucalypts, either in or about such pools. These are very thirsty trees and will drink up and keep dry very considerable areas after the trees have attained some size. Swamps in Italy and France have been reclaimed through use of eucalypts.

Petrograd Scene of Riots.

Washington.—A dispatch from the American legation at Christiania said reliable information had reached there that Petrograd was burning in 12 different places and that there was indiscriminate massacre of people in the streets. Slaughter of citizens, pillaging and riots were taking place in all parts of the city, the report said. According to these reports, there is no semblance of law or police or military regulations.
