### Over the Top Once Again

Sherman county early Monday morning reported to state headquarters that this section of the state of Oregon had responded to the financial call of the nation for subscribers to the Victory Liberty Loan with the full amount allotted to Sherman county having been subscribed in full.

The quota for Sherman county was \$118,350; of this amount \$47,700 was assigned Wasco, \$43,875 to Moro and \$26,725 to Grass Valley. Twenty-three other Oregon counties have made similar reports regarding their quotas.

The Victory Loan calls for \$4,500,000,000. In place of the usual bonds given subscribers of previous loans this will be handled through short time notes of the government drawing 4 1/2% interest, convertible into 3 1/2% notes, if desired, that are virtually free of all taxation. To the average investor the large interest will be more attractive, but to the investor of large means the notes calling for less interest will be more attractive because of income and tax exemption features. Both classes of notes are payable in 1923 and may be paid by the United States in 1922 if the government so desires.

### I. O. O. F. Centennial Anniversary

In commemoration of Thomas Wilder, who on April 26, 1819, with four other charter members founded the Independent Order of Oddfellows, Sherman county members have planned an elaborate celebration to take place Saturday at Kent.

The cardinal principles of the order which will be emphasized in the program of the celebration are embodied in the following mandatory requirements: "We command you to visit the sick; relieve the distressed and educate the orphan." There are 35,000 Oddfellow lodges in existence today with 2,230,000 members, and it is said to be the largest benefit paying order in the world. It pays annually for relief \$6,809,899.65.

There are 220 Oddfellow lodges in Oregon, with a membership of 20,619. There are 65 encampments and 231 Rebekah lodges, with a membership of 4135 and 18,948 respectively. The motto of the order is "Friendship, love and truth."

### Constructive Farm Improvements

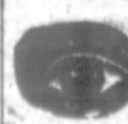
Editor Ireland accompanied Contractor O. A. Ramsey to Kent last Monday, where Mr. Ramsey has a residence under construction for J. C. Wilson near that town. The trip was made in the Light Six Studebaker owned by Mr. Ramsey and for an easy riding car and a hill puller it is hard to beat. The return was made via Rutledge, where a stop was made for a "look see" over the new farm home of Mr. and Mrs. Clyde Smith, just south of the Rutledge corners.

The Smith home is situated in an ideal location, where a knoll has been leveled to provide a setting for the new 11-room residence, a modern structure in all particulars provided with fireplace, electric lights from a Delco system, hot and cold water, etc.

What is particularly pleasing is the many built-in conveniences and the hard wood floors in the main part of the house, not forgetting to mention the large, roomy, deep basement, 32 feet wide by 30 feet long, having concrete floor over all.

More such farm houses in the county, seconded by telephone service, rural mail facilities and good roads, will make farm life in Sherman county the most attractive of any part of the United States.

Many gardeners make a mistake in not leaving enough space between plants for best development. Thinning should be done before the plants begin to crowd and to grow slender and weak. Head lettuce should have 8 to 10 inches distance, radish 1 inch, beets, carrots, onions and parsnips 2 to 3 inches, and sugar corn, squash, cucumbers and pumpkins should have three vigorous plants, not crowding each other, to the hill.

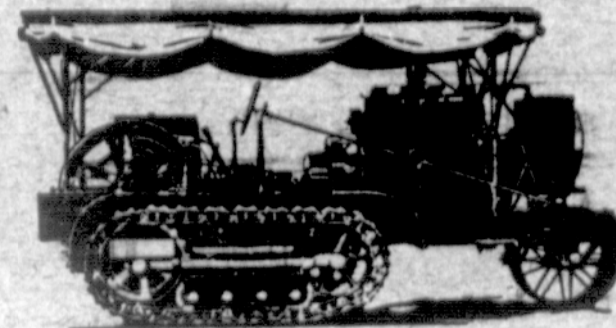
