At the booster meeting held in the opera house Wednesday evening, it was voted to authorize the city council to issue bonds to improve the water system and build a 200,000 gallon capacity reservoir at a higher elevation than the present one now serving the city. Undoubtedly both projects will be undertaken early next year.
