IN MEMORIAM

John D. McDermid was born October 18, 1850, near Nottawa, Ontario, Canada, died at Portland, Oregon, February 21, 1920, at the age of 69 years, 4 months and 3 days. He was a son of Dougald and Jeannette McDermid, was one of eleven children 4-boys and 7 girls. Four sisters and three brothers have preceded him in death. Archie passed away 10 days before him, two sisters, Mary McCarl and Elizabeth, Cameron of Collingwood, Canada and a number of nephews and nieces survive him. He married Eliza Smith at The Dalles, Oregon, December 8, 1896, who is left to mourn his loss. He grew to manhood in Canada coming to Oregon in 1890 locating in Sherman County near Wasco where he continued to reside till a few months ago when he went to Portland for medical treatment. Mr. McDermid was a very highly respected citizen of this county and his loss will be mourned by his many friends.
