Churchill was the only one attending from outside the county, he having a place on both the morning and afternoon program.

County road crews are being assembled at Moro for the purpose of working on the road leading from town past the county fair grounds, known locally as the Lone Rock road. This road is one of the four selected by the county court to be improved with the aid of the state highway commission under the market road act. Work will begin at the railroad crossing and the grade reduced to a six per cent. Under an arrangement made between the county and the Moro council material excavated will be used to bring the main streets of the city to grade.
