The Presbyterian people have been wanting a piano in their church for some little time and this week the Dorcas society purchased an instrument and installed the same. The proposed two mill tax levy bill for elementary schools that is to be referred to the people at the May election provides that two mills shall be levied on all the property of the state but that the money raised in each county shall be used entirely by the schools of that county. This does not take the place of the per capita tax but may take the place of part of the special tax. By the plan of division each one teacher school in this county will receive \$756 more than it has been accustomed to receive.

For the present the state land board has money to loan on first mortgages on lands based upon conservative valuations. One person may borrow as much as \$5000, payable one year after date, but so long as the interest is paid promptly it may run for ten years. The interest is six per cent. Service is prompt, not any red tape about it, only a few simple business requirements. The state of Oregon needs interest for its school fund and has this money to loan while it may last.
