According to F. L. Kent, Oregon field agent for the United States bureau of crop estimates, the acreage of the wheat crops in Oregon, as compared with a year ago, are 90 per cent of normal as compared with last year. This takes into consideration the bumper crops of two and three years ago. The winter wheat acreage is 3,500,000 less than a year ago and the spring wheat acreage 600,000 less.
