Section Crew Careless With Fire

Section men, burning trash at Hay Canyon Monday, July 5th, became careless and left while the fire was yet hot with the result that the wind drove it toward the unloading platform where a flat car on which was a combine was standing.

The running grass fire caught another pile of trash under the platform with the result that the unloading platform was burning smartly when O. E. Baker chanced to pass that way about 4:30 p. m. He saw the situation, could find no one near any of the houses, and climbed into the A. S. Porter home through a window where he phoned the alarm to Klondike and from there A. B. Potter relayed it into Wasco via auto, the Wasco phone station being closed.

Shortly after Mr. Baker got back to the fire from the Porter phone, Del Wright appeared, being summoned by the column of smoke from his farm and was soon followed by one of the section crew, who summoned the rest from where they were working about a quarter of a mile away and by quick work the fire was gotten under control just as several auto loads of fire fighters came from Wasco.

Damage was confined to the unloading platform, 80 per cent destroyed; the freight car, 25 per cent of the decking burned away; and the combine scorched.

If allowed to burn ten minutes past the time of discovery all property at Hay Canyon would have been destroyed. Mr. Baker is entitled to something more substantial than a vote of thanks for his presence of mind.
