Sherman County Day

Wednesday, October 6th, is Sherman County Day at the Wasco County Fair in The Dalles. Committees in different parts of Sherman county are working to make this the banner day of our neighbor county fair. A local committee comprising F. E. Forner, W. H. Ragdale, N. W. Thompson and Roy Kusman are in charge for Moro and vicinity. Wasco town is reported as having fifty cars agreed to go from there and Moro and Grass Valley is trying to do as well. All cars will meet at the beginning of the pavement three mile east of The Dalles at 10 a.m. where cloth banners and other car decorations will be ready for every motorist and from there all will join in one long parade through The Dalles to the fair grounds.

Notice to County Fair Exhibitors

To those exhibiting dahlias at the coming annual county fair the superintendent suggests the stems be cut close to the flower and then place your dahlias in individual plates or saucers. Mark each flower, whether a single specimen or exhibit of dahlias. To those desiring to exhibit cooking or dairy products we wish to state we will put all such exhibits in glass show cases and do all in our power to keep them clean to return to the owners. The county fair board is building three large cabinets for the more delicate pieces of fancy work and china painting. Let us reward these efforts by bringing all we have to exhibit. Remember the entry fee has been removed this year. Numerous changes have been made in the premium books. If you haven't one, get it now. They are at the local stores, in the hands of superintendents, and at C. C. Calkin's office.
