The building occupies a corner on Main street 100 by 100 feet and is planned to give the maximum in efficient service in all departments. It has a large space for the repair and over hauling of cars as well as convenient and accessible storage space for car owners, commodious show rooms, and well appointed offices.

This is due in part to the fact that Manager Goff, when planning the building, had the advice and assistance of the Portland office for Ford Products and their efficiency expert made several visits to Moro during the construction period with the result that the building conforms to plans of the most modern garages of any city anywhere.

The DesChutes Motor Co. is a young business firm in this county, making rapid progress since Mr. Goff and Mr. Hathaway organized the company one year ago on October 4th. At that time they secured the contract for Fordson tractors for Sherman county of Vick Bros., then state distributors, later Mr. Goff purchased his partners interest, interested local capital and incorporated the present company, he being made president and manager, securing in the early summer the Ford contract for all Ford products for Sherman county and Wasco county east of the DesChutes river, becoming distributors for all Ford and Fordson parts and supplying all Ford service stations from Moro in this section.

No suitable location being available for a company of such rapid growth a corporation was promoted known as the Moro Building and Investment Co. and capital provided for the erection of the present building. Stock holders assisting in this were F. E. Fortner, L. L. Peetz, R. S. Goff, Howard Belshee, A. Rose, Roy Powell, O. L. Belshee, A. Hunter, D. C. Wheat, W. C. Bryant, C. E. Johnson was one of the original stock holders, but his interests were purchased by D. C. Wheat.

When speaking about the success of the company Mr. Goff said that he did not claim any of the credit for the splendid achievement, but that it was made possible by the loyal whole hearted citizens of Moro and surrounding country.

Be sure that your name is on every article and that you have indicated in just which class you want it shown. Do not forget that every exhibit of wheat, each piece of fancy work, every display of garden vegetables will help to make competition keener and the fair that much better. You will also remember that there is no entrance fee this year for exhibits.

The Sherman County Fair belongs to Sherman county people and it succeeds just to the degree that it is supported by the people of Sherman county. The program mapped out is such that it will be well worth your while to attend every day this year. Wednesday morning the exhibits will be judged. In the afternoon a good racing program is in store for you. Thursday morning the last of the live stock will be judged and a good racing program will take up the afternoon. Friday morning the consignment sale of pure bred Shorthorns will be held and the last of the horse racing program will be held Friday afternoon. Saturday ten of the best racing cars built, driven by men holding national and international dirt track records will race for high honors on the local track.

The Sherman County Fair Association has joined the North Pacific Racing Association, thus making it impossible for the race horse men to pull the races as has frequently been done in the past. Fifty-nine horses have already been signed up in the harness races and a large per centage of them will be on hand. The indications are that the running horses will have to go for the money.

The auto racing feature on Saturday is not only new but one of the biggest cards that any fair has been able to put on. These men make a specialty of half mile dirt tracks. You will not be disappointed. Come prepared to see some speed. A passenger carrying aeroplane will be here, good music and entertainment will be on the grounds every day and evening. Remember all concessions and attractions will be on the grounds this year.
