### JAPAN IS AGAINST U. S. CABLE CONTROL

Tokio.—Decision to maintain its stand against the demand of the United States for control of the cable lines between Shanghai, Guam and the island of Yap has been reached by the Japanese cabinet. It is said by newspapers here, Japan is willing there should be a joint control of the cables by this country and the United States, say the newspaper Nichi Nichi and the Yomi Uri Shimbun states a third power has offered to mediate. Viscount Uchida, foreign minister, is declared to have proposed that the question be referred to the league of nations, where favorable decision might be anticipated, since France and England are said to be irritated by America's demand for the control of certain Atlantic cable lines.

### MRS. HARDING ENTERTAINED

Wife of President Shows Next First Lady New Home.

Washington. — For the first time within the memory of the oldest attaché of the White House, a first lady of the land entertained Monday a next first lady of the land.

Mrs. Florence Kling Harding, wife of the president-elect, was the guest of Mrs. Edith Bolling Wilson, wife of the president, at an informal tea for two at the executive mansion. Mrs. Wilson met her guest in the front hall and escorted her to the blue room, where tea was served.

After Mrs. Wilson and Mrs. Harding had chatted a while, they walked about the White House through the green and red rooms and the state dining room over which Mrs. Harding will be called upon to preside after next March 4.

### Sinn Fein Wants Peace.

Dublin.—The Rev. Michael O'Flanagan, acting president of the Sinn Fein, has sent the following telegram to Premier Lloyd George: "You state that you are willing to make peace at once, without waiting for Christmas. Ireland also is willing. What step do you propose?"

### Plebiscite Favors Former Ruler.

Athens.—The people of Greece have voted in favor of the return of Constantine to the Greek throne. Official announcement was made that Sunday's plebiscite resulted overwhelmingly in favor of the recall of the ex-king from Lucerne.
