IN MEMORIAM

After many months of suffering, Soren Hansen died in this city Thursday evening, March 17th, from a cancerous affection that had caused him to be confined to his bed the past five months and which had made him practically helpless for the past year.

Funeral services were conducted from the Presbyterian church Sunday morning, the many floral offerings in memory of Mr. Hansen completely filling the altar rail and filling the space in front of the pulpit. The church was crowded with his personal friends and the many friends of the family of whom a large number attended from his former home at Kent, Rev. E. E. McVicker, pastor of Moro Presbyterian church, delivered the sermon and was assisted with the service by Rev. H. H. Miles, pastor of Moro Methodist church. Interment was in the family plot in Moro cemetery.

Soren Hansen was born in Klagen Denmark, August 8th, 1858; died in Moro, Oregon, March 17th, 1921; he came to this country in 1874, at the age of 25 years, and to Oregon in 1902, first locating at Eugene; moving to Sherman county in 1904, locating at Kent and later moving to Moro. He married Katherine Boesen, in Michigan, July 31st, 1886; to this union eight children were born, two passing away in infancy and two daughters five years ago. He leaves to mourn his departure a wife, four children, five brothers, and one sister; the children are Ove Hansen, living at Kent; George, Elmer, and Mrs. Hattie Brishin, living at Moro; one brother lives at Renton, Wash., and a sister at Ottawa, N. D.
