National Wheat Marketing Plan

County agent Calkins spent a couple of weeks attending a meeting of the farmers of the Northwest who were gathered to hear an address, delivered by J. K. Howard, president of the American Farm Bureau Federation and to hear Wm. G. Ehardt, a member of the grain marketing committee of 17 explain the marketing plan as adopted by the committee.

This plan is very similar to the one used by the wheat growers of the northwestern states and Manager Jewett states that he sees no reason why all the wheat of the country cannot be marketed through the Central Sales Agency which this plan provides for. Other strong features are the \$100,000,000 finance corporation and the export corporation.

A call was sent to each state to elect delegates to attend a ratification conference which will pass on the plan worked out by the committee in Chicago on April 6th. Oregon gets two, Idaho two and Washington three delegates. The men who will represent Oregon are S. R. Thompson of Pendleton and V. H. Smith of Wasco. Geo. A. Mansfield, president of the State Farm Bureau has been called to attend a conference at Washington, D. C. immediately after this meeting and may be present at the ratification conference as well.

Just as soon as the contract is perfected and adopted it will be put in the field. There has been a nationwide interest in the work of the committee of 17 because of its great importance to American agriculture and it is very evident to every one who has had an opportunity to talk to any members of the committee, that the work done in the Northwest will be doubly effective through the aid of the national association.

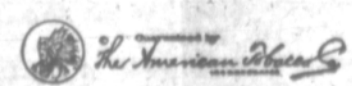
