All the county agents of eastern Oregon spent Wednesday of this week inspecting the local experiment station. In addition to ten county agents from Walla Walla, Malheur, Union, Umatilla, Morrow, Lake, Crook, DesChutes, Wasco and Sherman counties there were also in the party Professors Hyslop, Potter and Fettes of O.A.C., Director P. V. Maris and Assistant Director F. L. Ballard of the extension service, and Supt. Dean of the Umatilla experiment farm.
