**Trains Wrecked Near Celilo**

One of the most disastrous wrecks in recent history of railroad operation in Oregon occurred about 12:30 a.m. Wednesday morning when trains 12 and 17 met in a head-on collision at mile post 97 just east of Celilo. The wreck was caused by reason of the transfer to the North Bank road because of Eagle Creek bridge being washed out by the floods from melting snow, both trains being on the east bound track, necessary to make the transfer from one road to the other.

As a result of the collision ten were killed and thirty injured. James Hannah is the only one from Moro known to have been on the train. He saved his life by consenting to give up his seat when asked by a woman who was later seriously injured. Another passenger was Walter, 18-year old brother of Martin Melzer, returning to the family home at Corvallis. Another Sherman county family in the wreck was H. B. VanGilder and wife of Wasco, reported injured and taken to the hospital.

Confusion of train orders is said to be the cause of the wreck.
