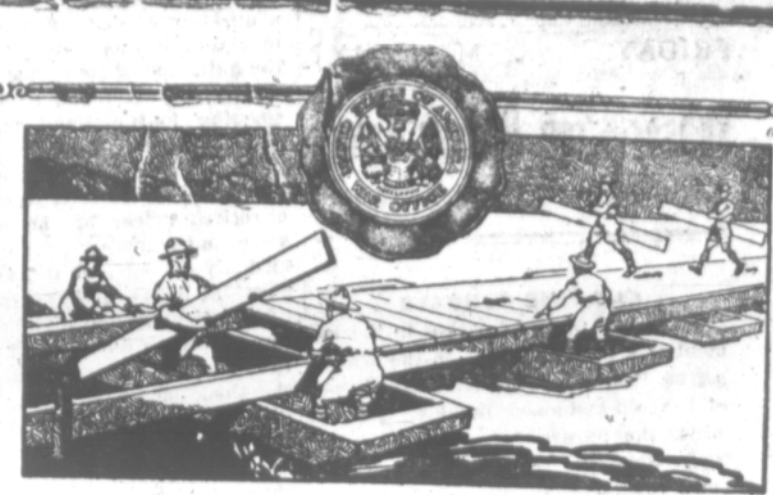

The United States is the first country in the development of waterpower, topping the list by a wide margin. Forty per cent of the working waterpower of the world is in the rivers and streams of this country, where a total capacity of 9,243,000 horsepower has been installed. The latest figures of the United States geological survey show.

It is estimated that there is yet in this country 18,757,000 horsepower in streams that could be harnessed to work for man.

The first of two surveys provided for in the contract of The Dalles-Oregon and Washington Toll Bridge company with the Union Bridge company of Portland covering the building of the interstate bridge across the Columbia at Seufert has been completed, and a tentative sketch of the type of bridge to be used is being exhibited in The Dalles. This sketch is causing much favorable comment, chiefly because it proves that it will not be necessary to place any piers in the water. The estimated cost of the bridge is about \$400,000.
