His Excellency Roland Ricci, writing of "The Fertile Land of Vergil" in The Forum, remarks of the production of silk there: "There extensive growth of mulberry, especially in northern Italy, permits a large production of silk worms, which furnish the raw material for Italy's flourishing silk industries. In this production Italy leads the nations of Europe. The orange and lemon groves produce about 8,000,000 quintals of fruit annually. Of this production 52 per cent consists of lemons, for which there is large demand in foreign countries. The total exportation of oranges and lemons before the war aggregated about 4,300 quintals, valued at 85,000,000 lire. In 1919, 2,100,000,000 were exported. The resumption of normal commercial relations may make way for a large increase in these exports. It is to be especially noted that Italy has almost a monopoly of citrous derivatives, chief among which is the output of citrous essence and citrate of calcium. Italian production in these two derivatives covers nine-tenths of the entire world output."
