The elimination process in choosing seed potatoes as practiced by many folks is a fine start for producing a small crop of the kind of potatoes that it makes you sore to receive from the grocery man. The one advantage connected with a crop from seed selected by this elimination process is the short time required to harvest the crop. The details of the process referred to are as follows: sell or use on the table all of the smooth, symmetrical, medium-sized potatoes you have. These potatoes were produced by healthy, vigorous vines. Save all the misshapen, pointed, crooked, scabby, and little potatoes for seed. They came from diseased hills in the field and are the culms of the bunch. If you want more like them plant your culls. Careful selection of smooth marketable potatoes for seed purposes reduces the percentage of disease and increases the yield.

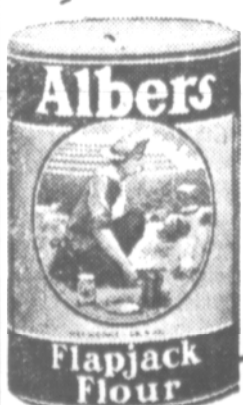

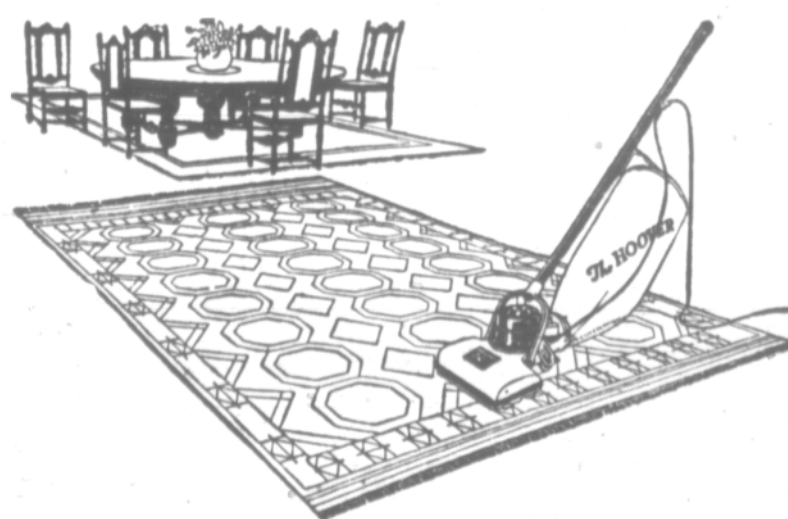
