NORTHWEST STATES GET FOREST MONEY

Portland, Or.—Oregon and Washington have just received \$179,418.85 from the federal government for roads and schools. Oregon, second on the list, draws \$110,015.21, while Washington receives \$69,303.54. The above amounts go to the counties of the two states in which there are national forest areas. The governors of 28 states have just been notified that 25 per cent of the \$3,421,531 received from timber sales, grazing permits and other sources of national forest revenue for the past fiscal year will be distributed by the forest service, United States department of agriculture. These moneys are returned to states in which national forests are located for expenditure upon schools and roads.

An additional 10 per cent of the total receipts is transferred to the forest service for the construction of roads and trails within the forests, and this sum for the present year amounts to \$238,576.

BRIEF GENERAL NEWS

An order opening to settlement on October 27, 10,000 acres of tule lands under the Klamath Irrigation project in Klamath county, Oregon, was formally signed by Secretary of the Interior Fall.

The Island of Naushon in Buzzards bay, owned by W. Cameron Forbes of Boston, has been selected by General John J. Pershing as the place where he will write his memoirs of the world war.

A total of at least 50 million bushels of wheat to be marketed co-operatively in the United States this year is estimated by George C. Jewett, general manager of the Northwest Wheat Growers Associated.

With New York's two clubs wearing the diamond crowns for the second year in succession—the first time in baseball history that one city has held such a monopoly on pennants—the Giants and Yankees renewed their world's series rivalry in the opening game Wednesday.

Secretary of State Hughes has announced the appointment of John Bassett Moore as the American member of the international commission of jurists which meets at The Hague December 10 to consider changes in international law as applied to new agencies of warfare.

Woman Appointed to U. S. Senate. Atlanta, Ga.—Mrs. W. H. Felton, 87 years old, of Cartersville, Ga., became the first woman member of the United States senate when she was appointed by Governor Thomas W. Hardwick to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Senator Thomas E. Watson until the people elect a successor in November.

Spokane, Wash.—Elmer L. Breckner, superintendent of schools at Olympia, was elected president of the Washington Educational association at the annual convention here. Mrs. Minnie D. Bean of Tacoma, retiring president, becomes vice-president.

Washington G. O. P. Reelects Hebbard. Seattle.—Charles Hebbard of Spokane was reelected chairman of the republican state central committee at a meeting here. Mrs. Emma Smith Devos was the choice for vice chairman.
