Oregon News in Brief

Winter wheat in Oregon showed a very decided improvement during April and a production of nearly 19,000,000 bushels is forecast by the bureau of agricultural economics.

Twenty-four market roads have been designated by the Lane county court upon which the state and county market roads funds will be expended. A total of \$88,582.66 is available for this work.

Twenty-four feet of snow blocks the McKensie pass at the summit of the Cascades, according to Harry G. Hayes, trapper and guide of McKensie bridge, who crossed the summit a few days ago.

Astoria has been designated as a quarantine port for ruminants and swine arriving from a foreign country as the result of a new order issued by the United States department of agriculture.

A cablegram has been received at Oregon City from Edward E. Brodie minister of the United States in Siam now en route with his family to the United States, that they have canceled their tour in China and are coming direct to the United States via Japan. They will arrive May 29.

Wasco Captures Track and Field Championship Honors

Wasco won the cup at the track and field meet at Grass Valley May 12th. Wasco's total in points was 89. Moro came second with 63. Grass Valley took third with 44. Kent brought up the rear with 3.

Moro started off strong, Moore winning first and Hockman second in the hundred yard dash, A division. Wasco took first and Moro second and third in the B division. Hoyt Barnett of Wasco took first in the half mile. Hockman and Anderson took second and third for Moro.

In the hurdles, Wasco and Moro broke about even. Kent took her total of three points with a second in the 120 yard hurdles, B division. In the A division shot put, Grass Valley took first, Wasco second and third. B division, in the shot put, Moro took a third, Wasco second, Grass Valley first.

In all three divisions of the broad jump Wasco took first. Moro took first in the discus throw; Wasco took first in the javelin. Moro ended the meet by winning the half mile relay.

It will be necessary for Wasco to win the cup again next year to retain it as a permanent possession.

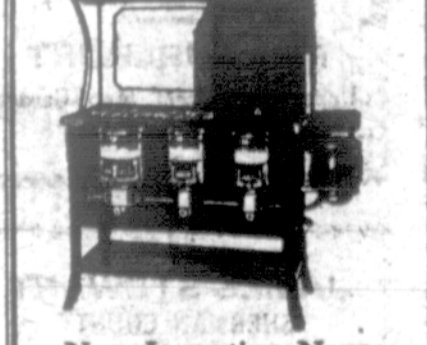
