PROBE OF MOTOR FREIGHT ORDERED

Olympia, Wash. — General and sweeping investigation of the auto freight business in the state of Washington as to rates, tariffs, operations, rules, regulations, and all other pertinent features has been instituted by a complaint filed by the state department of public works upon its own motion. The complaint is directed against the Western Washington Motor Freight association, which has about 80 members, and against all other auto transportation companies operating under certificates in the state, a total of about 110 operators.

The immediate cause of the investigation was the filing with the department of local and joint freight tariffs and time schedule of the Western Washington Motor Freight association, naming class and commodity rates between points in western Washington.

CHINESE BANDITS FIGHT

One Regular Officer and Five Men Reported Killed.

Tientsin. — One officer and five Chinese troops of the regular army were killed in a battle between the soldiers and the bandits who are holding 14 men of foreign countries captives in the Pootzu hills of Shantung, according to official reports issued by the Chinese military authorities here.

The military governor of Shantung has ordered 1500 additional troops toward Pootzu to give battle, despite the threat of the brigands that all foreign captives would be killed unless the Chinese troops were withdrawn entirely, it was learned here. It is reported that 60 Chinese children are among the captives being held.

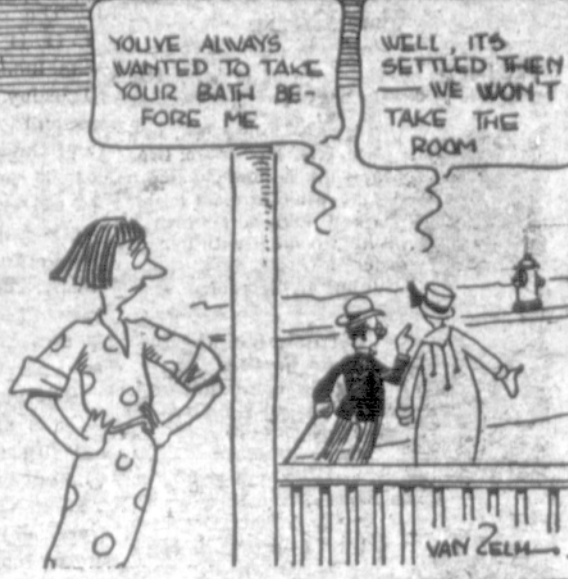

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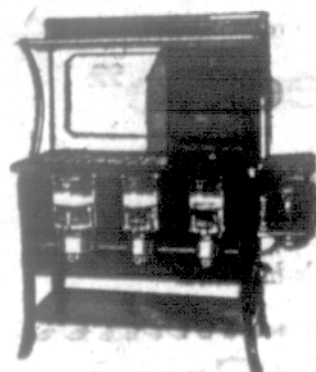
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
