The bulk of Klamath county wool is still unsold. The commercial fishing season in the upper Rogue river will commence at midnight Friday. Joseph T. Glenn of Aberdeen, S. D., has been elected city superintendent of Eugene schools. Uniform drill by 1000 children will be one of the big features of Jackson county school day at Ashland Saturday. Sixteen of the 31 jurors summoned to serve during the next term of the Marion county circuit court are women.

TURKS AND GREEKS SETTLE DIFFERENCES

Lausanne.—Danger of war between Greece and Turkey has been averted, it was announced following an amicable settlement of the differences threatening a break. After a three-hour conference M. Venizelos, the Greek delegate, emerged from the conference room and cried, dramatically: "It is peace!" The delegates are hopeful that Israel will be able to secure Angora's acceptance. It is said that the agreement grants to Turkey as reparation payment not only Karsgatch but the railway to the north of the town, which will necessitate a slight rectification of the frontier. Under the agreement Greece renounces the principle of indemnity for reparations. Turkey renounces its claims to indemnity in cash.

Loss of more than a million dollars was suffered when the Santa Fe bridge spanning the Mississippi river at Fort Madison, Iowa, was badly damaged by fire. Elliot Wadsworth, American financial envoy and allied representative, signed the Rhine coast agreement whereby the United States will be repaid for occupational expenses in 13 years. The small but steady increase in the percentage of desertions from the navy has been called officially to the attention of the commanding officers ashore and afloat by the navy department. S. senator, a plan unique in American politics was agreed upon by the three candidates. The two other farmer-labor candidates are Magnus Johnson and Charles A. Lindberg. The three candidates with the understanding that no more farmer-labor aspirants will file, met with the state central committee and entered an agreement whereby all three will campaign together for the nomination and will hold no separate meetings. Billion Offered for U. S. Ships. Washington, D. C.—The shipping board will investigate thoroughly the offer of more than \$1,000,000,000 received for the entire government merchant fleet and if the bidders back up their proposal, "there can be no doubt the board will make the award to them." The offer was presented by John W. Black, president of the Columbia Postal Supply company of Silver Creek, N. Y. Reparations Not Discussed With U. S.
