

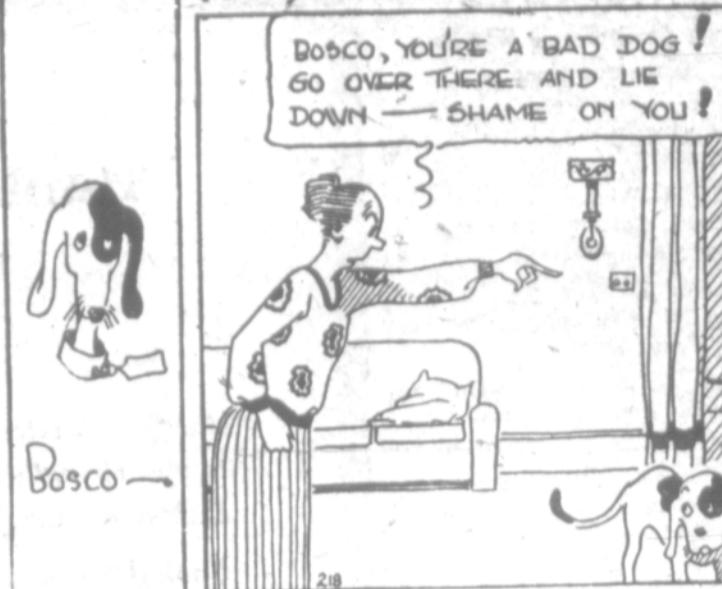
Oregon News in Brief

The Oregon supreme court has issued an order restraining the directors of the Union high school district at Hermiston, Umatilla county, from spending any of the district funds until the court determines whether the consolidation was brought about in compliance with the laws.

The first of four ocean-going log rafts to be dispatched this summer by the Benson Lumber company to its mill at San Diego left the Columbia river in tow of the Puget sound tug Humacoma, assisted by the Ononeta. The raft contains 6,000,000 feet of logs and a deckload of telephone poles.

Governor Pierce has announced the personnel of the commission which will investigate the Oregon automobile license law and report to the legislature at its next regular session in 1925. Members of the commission are W. B. Dennis, of Carlton, and James S. Stewart, of Corvallis, selected by the governor, and James H. Cassel, John H. Hall and C. L. Boss, of Portland, selected by the dealers' association.

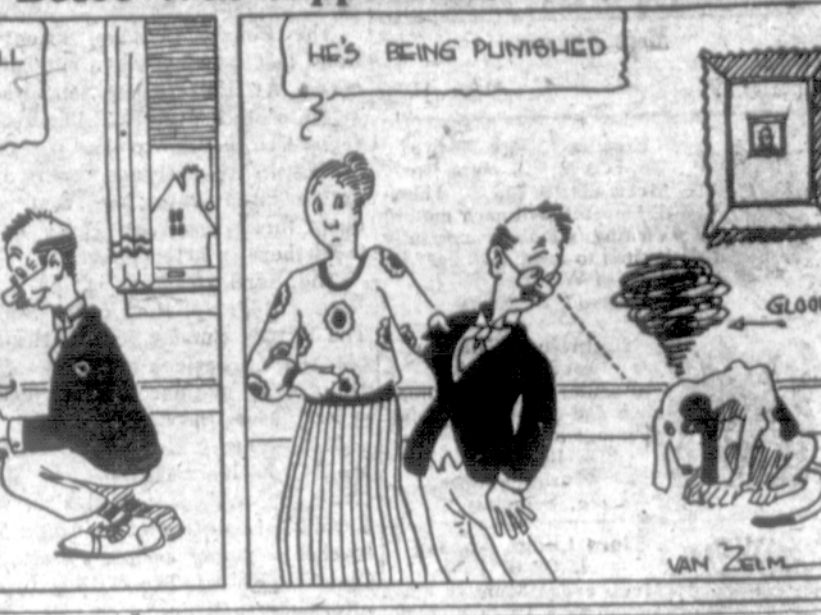

ACCIDENT IN HARDING PARTY

Writers Killed When Auto Plunges Over Embankment.

Denver, Colo.—Sumner Curtis, representative of the republican national committee; Thomas F. Dawson, director of the historical department of the Colorado Historical and Natural History society; and Tommie French, a statistician for the Great Western Sugar company of Denver, were killed and Donald A. Craig, manager of the Washington bureau of the New York Herald was injured Sunday when the automobile in which they were riding in the mountains near Denver overturned and plunged over a 75-foot embankment.

The automobile was carrying a party of newspaper men who were accompanying President Harding on his western tour, as was Curtis.

HEAT FATAL TO MANY

Blazing Sun Claims 22 Victims in Five Days in Chicago.

Chicago.—The heat wave, taking almost unprecedented toll of lives in the Middle West the last week, is expected to continue, the weather bureau declared here.

Twenty-two persons have died from heat in five days in Chicago. The high temperatures, a blazing sun and little wind have taken a toll of scores in other parts of the midwest.

The hot wave was broken temporarily in parts of the Northwest by storms which killed two and injured one in Minnesota.

Thousands are flocking to the Northern summer resorts. Special steamers on the Great Lakes are handling crowds fleeing from the heat.
