OREGON YOUTH FOUND GUILTY OF MURDER

Coquille, Or.—Alton Covell, charged with first degree murder for strangling his stepmother, Mrs. Ebba Covell, to death with ammonia fumes September 3, near Bandon, was convicted as charged by the jury which heard his case. The verdict was brought in after the jurors had deliberated but forty-five minutes, and life imprisonment was recommended, instead of the death penalty. The boy, 16 years of age, was indicted jointly with his uncle, Arthur Covell, a crippled recluse and astrologer. The uncle has already been convicted of murder in connection with the case and has been sentenced to be hanged. The youth's defense was based largely upon the allegation that the murder had been planned and instigated by the uncle and that the boy, admittedly of low mentality, had been led into the crime by the influence of the older man.

CONFER ON IMMIGRATION

Some for Lifting, Some for Lowering of Bars. New York.—Demands for a change in the present immigration quota law, which expires next June, were made by a score of speakers at the national immigration conference here, although they split into three factions in advocating methods of its execution. Industrialists and agriculturists stood together in an appeal for selective immigration to furnish laborers. Administration forces, led by Assistant Secretary of Labor Henning, advocated further restrictions under the existing law, a view which is understood to have the approval of labor. Representatives of European nations, together with welfare organizations for immigrants from these countries, branded immigration restrictions as inhumane and urged that the bars be lifted.

Washington "Pah" Population Larger. Walls, Wash.—The population at Washington state penitentiary shows an increase of 3 per cent over a year ago. On December 14, 1923, the register at the state institution contained 763 names. This year on the same date 773 were marked present.

HOUSE INSURGENTS WIN CONCESSION

Nelson of Wisconsin to Be Placed on Important Rules Committee.

Washington, D. C.—An agreement which may end the tie-up in the house over committee assignments was reached by republican and insurgent leaders. Under the agreement a republican insurgent will be placed on the rules committee, which directs the house legislative program, and the democrats will be denied additional representation.

RANCHERS HID ROBBERS

Florence, Or.—Jack Herring and Nels Bergram, veteran ranchers of the country 11 miles north of here, are under arrest after having confessed to harboring the three men who held up and robbed the Florence State bank last Tuesday.

It was reported in connection with the arrests, although not yet confirmed, that Herring and Bergram admitted splitting \$1500 given them by the robbers as the price of a hiding place while possemen encircled their avenues of escape in every direction. Then, conscience-stricken, according to reports reaching here, Herring called an officer and told of the deal, and soon afterwards Bergram was arrested. Steady advertising is a business asset.

Overtures Made to U. S. By Soviet

Washington, D. C.—A soviet note asking for negotiations with the United States to bring about formal recognition of the Russian government has been received at the White House. The United States government has not decided yet whether to reply to the communication of the Russian soviet government, it was declared at the state department. The note from Moscow is the first move towards negotiations for an understanding between the United States and Russia, state department officials said. No conversations have proceeded the Russian communication, it was said.

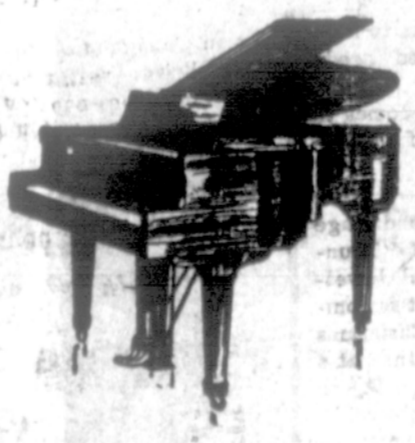

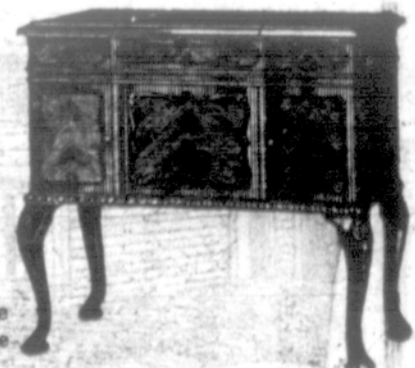
