**Brief Resume of Happenings of  
the Week Collected for  
Our Readers.**

The spring salmon fishing season on the Columbia river will open at noon Thursday.

The Elwood cheese factory in Tillamook was destroyed by fire with a loss of \$15,000.

Dry weather has brought unprecedented early forest fires to the mid-Columbia district.

A total of 22,271 voters in Marion county have registered for the primary election May 16.

A report issued by County Clerk Clinton shows there are in Clatsop county 842 registered voters.

Pears, cherries and prunes were damaged at Eugene to some extent by the cold weather last week.

The Standard Oil company of California will establish an extensive fueling and distributing plant at Astoria.

Recall petitions against County Commissioners Roney and Sharp were filed with the Lane county clerk at Eugene.

The first local grown head lettuce of the year was marketed in The Dalles last week, bringing \$8.50 a crate.

Mrs. Charles R. Shuey, 37, of La Grande, was killed in an automobile accident, when a car she was driving turned over on top of her.

At the close of one and a half days of campaigning students subscribed \$84,080 toward a student union building at the University of Oregon.

With 45 of the 75 necessary recruits already signed up, The Dalles is assured of having a machine gun unit of the Oregon national guard.

Low temperature of from 16 to 25 degrees above zero in Umatilla county did damage to the fruit crop that will run into the thousands of dollars.

Cleo Campbell, 20, son of A. J. Campbell, living near Ballston, was killed when a tractor he was operating on his father's farm overturned, crushing him back.

The special tax of more than \$26,000 levied last fall by the Warrenton road district for highway improvement purposes was declared illegal by Judge Eakin at Astoria.

H. C. Waddell of Roseburg, of the official staff of the state department, American Legion, has been appointed by Governor Pierce to go to Seattle and inspect the battleship Oregon.

Fruit men in San Francisco are circulating a petition to boycott all lumber items moving from Oregon mills in retaliation for Oregon's embargo against California fruits, it is reported.

An initiative petition to abolish capital punishment in Oregon was filed with the secretary of state at Salem by the Oregon Anti-Capital Punishment league. The bill will be voted on in November.

The city of Eugene will bond itself for \$500,000 to build an auditorium for the University of Oregon as part of the \$5,000,000 gift campaign, according to plans made by 60 of the leading business men of the city.

A. L. Lovett, professor of entomology at Oregon Agricultural college, and a nationally recognized authority on certain phases of entomological work, died at his home in Corvallis as a result of complications following a case of septic sore throat.

Meister and Hood River valleys were visited by heavy frosts Wednesday and Thursday of last week, resulting in widespread damage to all the early fruit. It was thought that most of the cherries, pears, prunes and early apples were badly damaged.

Approximately 22,000,000 feet of government timber in Oregon was sold last week at the United States land office in Portland for approximately \$40,000. The sale included holdings in Columbia, Washington, Clackamas, Yamhill, Benton and Polk counties.

Seeding of spring wheat, oats and barley is nearing completion in the middle sections of Oregon, according to the weekly crop summary of the weather bureau, and early spring grain is germinating fairly well, but rain is needed to bring up later seedings.

James Benton, cousin of Robert Fulton, inventor of the steamboat, and of Thomas H. Benton, United States senator from Missouri forty years ago, died at his home in Eugene at the age of 83 years. He was a pioneer of 1844, and crossed the plains by ox team.

Calvin T. Funk post, American Legion of Cottage Grove, has gone on record as opposing the settlement of a major part of the northern portion of Lane county by Doukhobors, a large colony of whom are said to be planning to move to this country from Canada.

Plans were completed at Salem for the first annual Chautauqua to be held under direction of the Oregon Jersey Cattle club. It will take place at the state fair grounds in Salem, May 23 and 24, and will succeed the
