

County Court Proceedings
Regular July Term

At the regular term of the county court for Sherman county, held on July 8d, the following business was transacted:

In the matter of continuing a widow's pension to Rosalie Orcutt: Same was ordered withdrawn.

Report of C. E. Johnson, county auditor, for the year 1923 was received, accepted and ordered placed on file.

In the matter of the resignation of Geo. B. Boushill as county treasurer: Same accepted and ordered placed on file.

In the matter of the application of N. W. Thompson to the appointment of county treasurer, made vacant by resignation: No action taken.

In the matter of the application of C. V. Bellnap to the appointment of county treasurer, made vacant by resignation: Appointment of applicant was made to fill unexpired term.

In the matter of bids received for proposed work on Shearer bridge road: All bids received on account proposed work rejected and ordered that the same be done by the county on force account.

In the matter of proposed work on Shearer bridge road: Ordered that the specifications for said work remain on file until such time as the work be undertaken.

In the matter of the petition of L. W. Amick and others to open a road across the J. C. Hartley place: Action of court was to open road on own resolution.

In the matter of change of road in district 12: By resolution of county court, change in road ordered and road master was instructed to post notices in accordance therewith.

In the matter of fixing time and place for the hearing of facts and argument concerning vacation of road in district nine: Order made that the same will be fully considered at the regular session of the September term of county court.

In the matter of the vacancy of the office of director on the county fair board by reason of removal of G. E. Mathews from the county: Vacancy declared to exist and T. W. Ally appointed to fill same.

In the matter of bill received from State Highway Commission on account of grading and surfacing the Wasco-Biggs section of the Sherman highway: Ordered that same be more fully considered at next term of county court.

In the matter of bill received from State Highway Commission on account of grading and surfacing the Moro-Grass Valley section of the Sherman highway and the construction of under crossing near Moro: Ordered that same be more fully considered at next term of county court.

In the matter of report of county road viewers concerning damage to property because of location of Sherman highway through town of Kent: Road viewers report estimated the damage to property and to the owners of same in blocks 22 and 23, 1st lotter addition to Kent to be as follows: Mrs. Ida Davis, lots 3 and 4, block 23, \$70; J. H. Wilson, lot 4, block 22, \$35; J. C. Wilson, lot 3 block 22, \$35. Final action continued until September term of court.

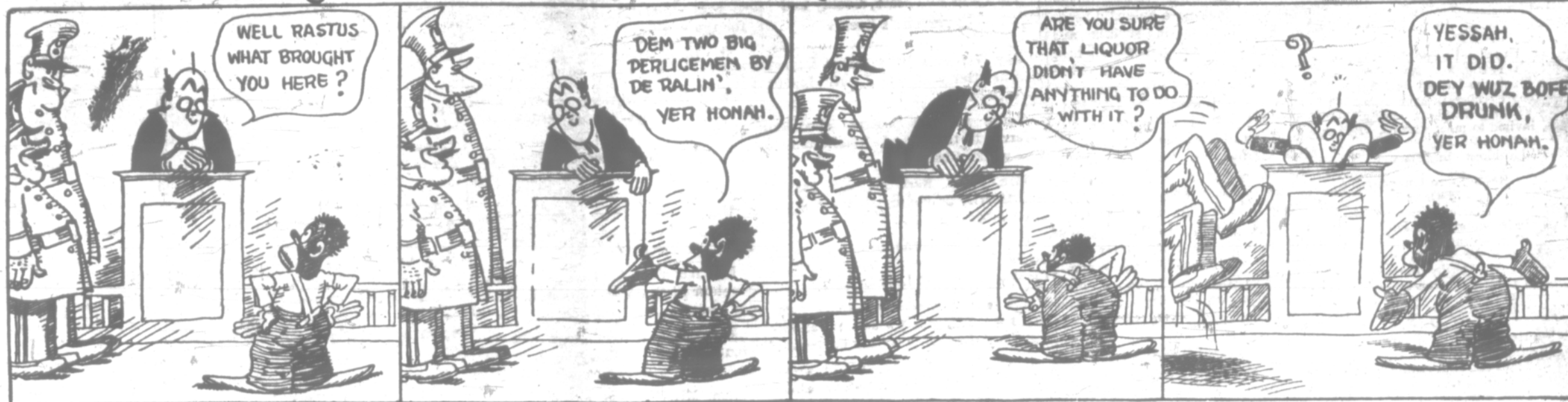
